Fees for School Programs and Historic Richmond Tours

- \$4 per child, \$60 minimum, for all programs on site
- One adult for every 10 students required and admitted free of charge
- Additional adults are \$4 each
- Outreach programs: \$4 per child with a \$90 minimum or \$6 per child with a \$100 minimum
- Walking and bus tours: \$2 per student per hour, plus cost of site visits
- \$25 deposit due one month before program

Historic Richmond Tours

Let Historic Richmond Tours help your students experience history!

From Colonial Richmond through the Civil War and beyond, our student walking and bus tours of Richmond, led by master guides and aligned with Virginia's SOL's, will enhance classroom instruction and make history come alive!

Ancients in Our Neighborhood

On this walking tour through Richmond's Court End, students explore Richmond architecture influenced by Egypt, Greece, and Ancient Rome.

Grades: 3 to 5 **Cost:** \$4 per student **Time:** 1 1/2 hours*

The Ancients in Our Neighborhood walking tour may be combined with the Greek By Design school program.

Capitol Square

This guided walking tour explores Capitol Square's rich history and architecture. An interior visit to the State Capitol can be added.

Grades: 4 to 6 **Cost:** \$4 per student **Time:** 2 hours*

Colonial Richmond

On this guided bus tour, with stops at Wilton House and the State Capitol, students gain knowledge of life in Colonial Richmond and discover some of the causes and results of the American Revolution.

Grades: 4 to 5 **Cost:** \$8 per student, plus site admissions **Time:** 4 hours*

Dawn of the 20th Century

On this guided bus tour, with a stop at the Maggie Walker Historic Site or the Bolling-Haxall House, students discover the social, economic, and technological changes in Richmond during the period from Reconstruction to the early 20th century.

Grades: 6 to 7 **Cost:** \$6 per student **Time:** 3 hours*

How a City Grows

On this combined bus and walking tour, younger students discover Richmond's history, geography, and architecture, as well as how our city and state function.

Grades: 3 **Cost:** \$4 per student **Time:** 2 hours*

Keeping It All in Check: Civics on the Road

On this guided bus tour, with stops at the Virginia House of Delegates and the John Marshall House, students examine the structure and powers of local, state, and national governments, as well as the judicial system established by the Constitution of the United States.

Grades: 7 **Cost:** \$8 per student, plus site admissions
Time: 4 hours*

The Nation's Beginnings

On this guided bus tour, with stops at St. John's Church and the State Capitol, students discover what a fall line is and why it was important to Richmond's development, as well as examine Richmond's role in the formation of the country.

Grades: 4 to 5 **Cost:** \$6 per student, plus site admissions
Time: 3 hours*

Richmond's African American Heritage

On this guided bus tour, with a stop at the Maggie Walker Historic Site or the Black History Museum and Capitol Square, students explore the important role African Americans have played in our city and state's history.

Grades: 4 to 12 **Cost:** \$6 per student, plus site admissions **Time:** 3 hours*

Richmond's Canals

This walking tour focuses on the development of Richmond's canals in the early 19th century, demonstrating their importance to the early history of Virginia, territorial expansion, industries, and the growth of the city.

Grades: 4 to 6 **Cost:** \$4 per student **Time:** 2 hours*

The Richmond's Canals walking tour may be expanded to accommodate changing school curricula.

Richmond and the Civil War

On this guided bus tour, with stops at Capitol Square, historic Tredegar, and either the Museum of the Confederacy or the Virginia Historical Society, students examine Richmond's role in the Civil War and the major events that took place here.

Grades: 4 to 6 **Cost:** \$8 per student, plus site admissions **Time:** 4 hours*

* Time and cost will vary depending on the size of the group and any additions to the tour, including time for lunch.

School Programs

Hands-on history investigations conducted by our teachers at the Richmond History Center or at your school.

A Colonial Community

The Richmond community in colonial times is examined through hands-on artifact investigations, playing colonial games, and creating a craft to take away.

Grades: Pre-K to 6 **Cost:** \$4 per student **Time:** 1 hour**



African Americans in Antebellum Richmond

Students explore the lives of African Americans through the use of artifacts, primary documents, stories, and games.

Grades: Pre-K to 12 **Cost:** \$4 per student **Time:** 1 hour**



Children in the House: Growing up in the 1800s

To learn about family life, education, clothing, and games from the 19th century, students use photographs, primary documents and reproduction artifacts, and tour the Wickham House.

Grades: Pre-K to 5 **Cost:** \$4 per student **Time:** 1 hour**



Era Explorations

Using photographs, video, and audio, this multi-media presentation assists students with their understanding of the times and attitudes of four eras. Select from these topics: *The Great Depression*, *Rosie the Riveter: The Homefront During WWII*, *Segregation/Integration*, and *Growth of a Modern City*.

Grades: 4 to 12 **Cost:** \$6 per student **Time:** 90 or 45 minutes



Greek by Design

Students discuss the elements of Greek and Roman decor and culture while touring a neoclassical historic house.

Grades: 3 to 12 **Cost:** \$4 per student **Time:** 1 hour**



Hands-On Richmond History

Using artifacts, documents, diaries, letters, oral histories, maps, drawings, photographs, pictures, newspapers, and reproduction objects, students engage in grade-level appropriate history inquiries.

Grades: K to 12 **Cost:** \$4 per student **Time:** 1 hour**



Powhatan Indians

Students use Indian artifacts to learn about the lives of the Eastern Woodlands Indians of Virginia and their reliance on natural resources.

Grades: Pre-K to 6 **Cost:** \$4 per student **Time:** 1 hour**



Waterways

Primary sources and hands on activities help students explore the value of the rivers to the people living in the Chesapeake Bay Watershed.

Grades: Pre-K to 5 **Cost:** \$4 per student **Time:** 1 hour**



Whose Hat Is That?

Using our collection of hats, students explore careers through the hats that people wear. They will create their own "career" hat.

Grades: Pre-K to 2 **Cost:** \$4 per student **Time:** 1 hour**
